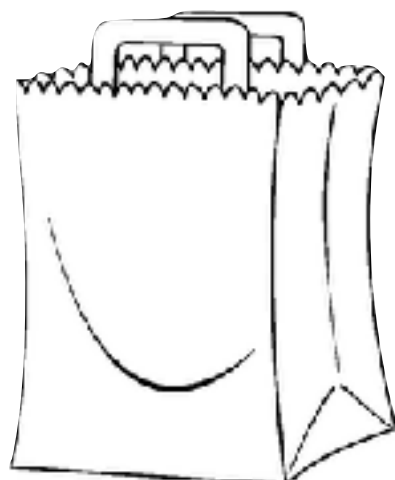
God Leads His Church | Church in Antioch

Acts 11:19-30

The people in the early church were so excited about how God loved them that they wanted to tell everyone they could. The good news began spreading to many cities. One of the first cities to hear about God's love was Antioch. God began to grow His church there in amazing ways. The church in Jerusalem heard about this and sent the disciple Barnabas to Antioch to see how God was working. Barnabas was so glad to see God's work that he brought Paul, another disciple, to stay in Antioch too. One day, some prophets came to the church in Antioch and told everyone that there was going to be a big famine in another part of the country called Judea. The Christians in Antioch were so filled with God's love that they decided to help the people in Judea by sending money so they could buy food. God's love showed them how to respond to a big need! God Leads His Church!

- What part do you think you can play in The Big God Story?

Child's name, may you know that your Heavenly Father loves you. May know God leads you and that you are part of His church and part of His Big Story. May His love fill you to love others.

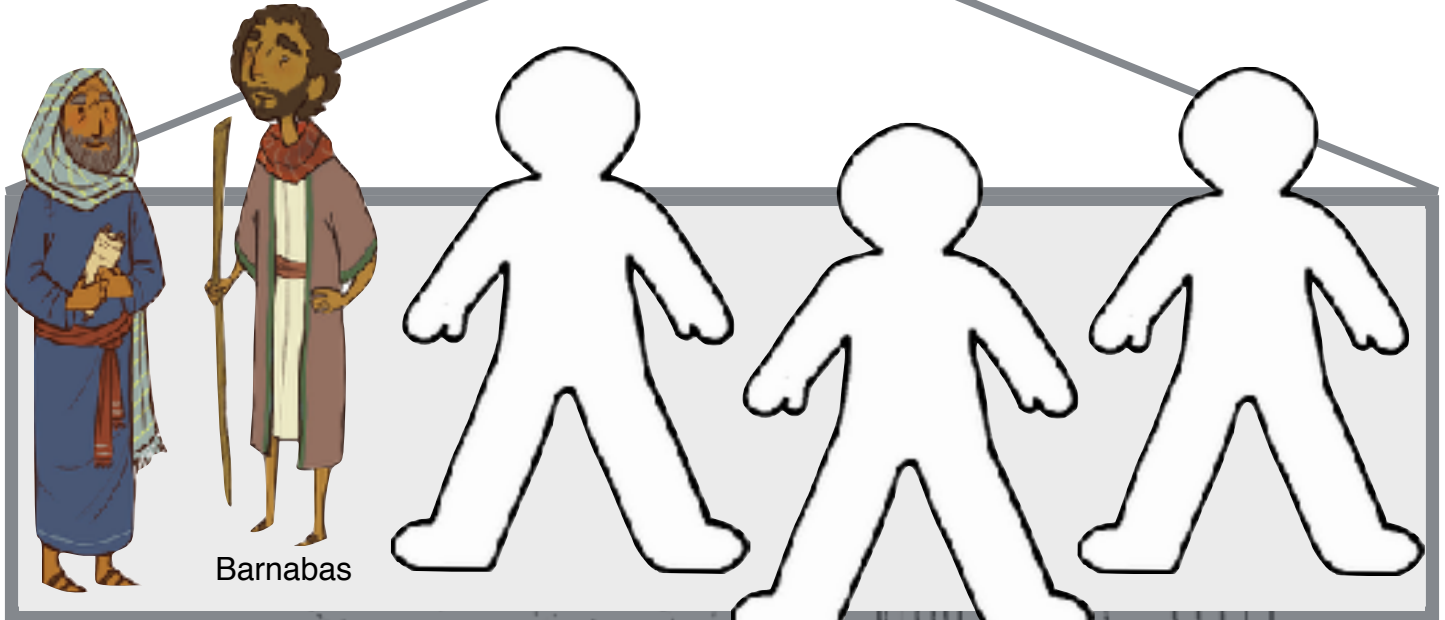

Church in Antioch Acts 11:19-30

The people in the early church were so excited about how God leads. The good news began spreading to many cities. One of the first cities to hear about God's love was Antioch. God began to grow His church there in amazing ways. The church in Jerusalem heard about this and sent the disciple Barnabas to Antioch to see how God was working. Barnabas was so glad to see God's work that he brought Paul, another disciple, to stay in Antioch too. One day, some prophets came to the church in Antioch and told everyone that there was going to be a big famine in another part of the country called Judea. The Christians in Antioch were so filled with God's love that they decided to help the people in Judea by sending money so they could buy food. God leads His church!

Discover

- Antioch enjoyed a prosperous economy due to its strategic location at the crossroads of trade routes south to Palestine and Egypt, east to Persia, and west to the Asia Minor Peninsula.
- Antioch was ranked the third-greatest city in the Roman Empire, with a population of more than 500,000.
- When the Jerusalem church heard of the growing number of believers in Antioch, they sent Barnabas—a godly and faith-filled man—to visit.
- It's in Antioch that believers were first named Christians (*christianous* or "little Christs").

Experience

Invite your children to pretend that each room in your home is a different city the disciples traveled to or from. Begin reading **Acts 11:19–30** standing in one room; each time you read that the people "came" or "went" to a new city, walk to a different room. Once you've finished reading, ask your kids why they think the people acted so generously. Explain that just as the people following Jesus then were so filled with God's love that they wanted to give, God has also filled each of us with His love to be used to build His kingdom today.

Follow

After reading through **Acts 11:19-30**, discuss these questions together:

- Why do you think the people scattered?
- What are some ways God led His church in this story?
- How does God lead His church today?

These questions can easily extend into the rest of the week. Look for opportunities to have conversations about how God Leads His Church in your everyday life.
