
**God Statement: God is Redeemer**

**Memory Verse:** The LORD is trustworthy in all he promises and faithful in all he does. Psalm 145:13b



**God Makes a Promise | Genesis 1:26-31; 2:4-25**

On the sixth day, God gave the first man the breath of life. God named him Adam. The Lord saw that it was not good for man to be alone, so He created Eve. Adam and Eve lived in a beautiful garden where they walked and talked with God. God promised to send a redeemer after Adam and Eve disobeyed God. He had a plan to rescue and redeem us from sin. God is Redeemer!



Repetition is an important part of your child's development and growth. Enjoy re-reading the story and declaring God is Salvation throughout the day. Use the extra activities to connect with God's Word this week.

**PRAY**

What animals do you see in the above picture? Make sounds for each one. How many fruit are in the tree? What do you think were Adam and Eve's favorite thing to do in the garden? Adam and Eve could talk to God in the Garden. What is your favorite time to pray (talk to God) together as a family? Whether it is before bedtime, a meal, or another time during the day, ask God to show you ways He is a redeemer. Think of something you can thank Him for each day.

**EXPERIENCE**

**Read Genesis 2:8-9,15-16** outside with your children, preferably while sitting on green grass, next to a tree, or near flowers. After you've read the passage, tell your children that when Adam and Eve lived with God in the garden of Eden, they walked and talked with Him.

- What things did God make and put in the garden?
- Who did God ask to take care of the garden?
- What do you think it would be like to walk with God in the Garden of Eden?

**BLESS**

## **SEPTEMBER | Week 1**

### **God Made a Promise**

#### **Genesis 1-3**

God created the world and everything in it. When the first people sinned, God already had a plan. He promised to one day send a Savior to restore—redeem our relationship with Him. God is Redeemer!

#### **Discover**

- God created us to live in the garden of Eden, to be in perfect relationship with Him, and to worship Him with all of our hearts, minds, and souls. We weren't intended to live in a broken world.
- In Genesis 3:15, God said to Satan, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."
- Jesus would be Eve's offspring, and He would have victory over Satan.
- The words of Genesis 3:15 are called the protevangelium, "the first gospel," because they were God's first promise to send the Redeemer—Christ.

#### **Experience**

**Read Genesis 2:8–22** outside with your children, preferably while sitting on green grass, next to a tree, or near flowers. After you've read the passage, tell your children that when Adam and Eve lived with God in the garden of Eden, they walked and talked with Him. Explain that Adam and Eve eventually disobeyed God and broke their relationship with Him, but God sent Jesus to restore that relationship. Share that we also sin, but God offers us forgiveness so we can be close to Him.

#### **Follow**

After reading through **Genesis 2:8-22**, discuss these questions together:

- How did God create Adam?
- What do you think it might have been like to live in the garden?
- What command did God give to Adam?

These questions can easily extend into the rest of the week. Look for opportunities to have conversations about how God is Redeemer throughout your everyday life.

#### **Bless:**
