


Moses was called to return to Egypt and free God's people from Pharaoh's rule. Moses knew that God is Lord and obeyed His command to return to Egypt. God is Lord!

- Point to the picture that shows Moses parting the Red Sea. Point to the picture that shows Moses as a shepherd. Point to the picture that shows Moses noticing the burning bush.



Repetition is an important part of your child's development and growth. Enjoy re-reading the story and declaring God is Lord throughout the day. Use the extra activities to connect with God's Word this week.

PRAY

God is with you.

- Ask God to help you know and trust that God is Lord over everything—fun times as well as sad times.
- Pray for others to know that God is with them.

EXPERIENCE

When God revealed His name to Moses in Exodus 3:14, He said, "I AM WHO I AM." What is your first name? What is your middle name? Why is a name important?

- Help you child write his or her name on a piece of paper. Talk about each of the letters that make up his or her name. Help your child color the paper. Hang on fridge and talk about how names are special.
- Write God is Lord on a piece of paper. Talk about how God is Lord in your life. Help your child color the paper. Hang on fridge to remind you that God is Lord!



BLESS




Exodus 2-11

Moses was called to return to Egypt and free God's people from Pharaoh's rule. Moses knew that God is Lord and obeyed His command to return to Egypt. God is Lord!

Discover

- When God revealed His name to Moses in Exodus 3:14, He said, "I AM WHO I AM."
- The Israelites needed to learn more about their great God. They needed to trust Him and know that He is the Lord of Lords and King of Kings.
- God chose specific plagues that corresponded with the deities of the Egyptians.
- Through all of the plagues, God proved He alone had the right to His people. He alone is the Lord.

Experience

Find a spot in front of a fireplace, campfire, or even a candle. Read through the biblical account of God's call on Moses' life in **Exodus 3:1—4:17**. Ask your children how they might have reacted to hearing God's voice coming from a burning bush if they'd been there. Remind them that only a powerful God could do something like that. Discuss together why God asked Moses to take off his sandals.

Follow

After reading through **Exodus 2-11**, discuss these questions together:

- Why did God tell Moses to take off his sandals?
- Why did God want to free His people from the Egyptians?
- How did God show He is Lord through the life of Moses?

These questions can easily extend into the rest of the week. Look for opportunities to have conversations about how God is Lord throughout your everyday life.
